STRATEGY	Reorient targeted policies and maximize financing for infrastructure (e.g. sewer) to add new capacity.	Maximize existing inventory by increasing turnaround for public housing renovation and cultivating LL relationships to increase homeless inventory.	Implement 'housing-focused' policies for contracts (e.g. reduce barriers, adopt a 'Housing First' philosophy)	Focus on data and establish clear performance metrics, and align metrics among public and private funders.	Prioritize enforcement / clean-up of public lands where unsheltered homeless individuals congregate	Establish linkages and programmatic partnership between homeless and criminal justice systems
