- Project Vision - no one on call
- Emma: Get priority list for staff and clients for vaccination so that when the time comes, ready and available.
- TEAM WorkHawaii - no one on call
- Alan, HPD
 - HONU - still in transition phase, in HMIS should all be transitioned already. Small tents now going inside of the bigger tents. For providers in day -- check the availability before call to make sure that there is something available to you. There is a special instruction on vacancy list. On site nothing really changed. Trying to get people out of HONU faster now. We have less staffing now than in 2020 -- trying to keep up. About 60 people there right now. Can ask me any specific questions.
 - JOC - trying to make best use of the space. Medical side utilized by HOME project on Mondays, also have specialty clinics on that side. If you have any partners that want to provide other medical services, let us know. Possibly will have 24/7 medical service coming in. Contact us if want to provide services in the space - Kelly main point of contact for scheduling.
 - Connie: If we have people going in for wound care on a few afternoons, would the 24 hour care conflict?
 - Alan: any new partners coming in have to work around the already existing schedules. 24/7 care that is currently being talked about - \$10/month health care, meds assistance -- would be on the medical side. We won't boot anyone already there out if a new provider comes in. Hoping things get back to some sense of normalcy at JOC.
- Deni, Steadfast Housing
 - Just opened 3rd floor at Kuwili, 18 beds available, going for \$1000, trying to open it up to CCS clients, if we can't then opening it up to others
 - Talking about the upper floors of the Punawai Reststop building
 - For chronically homeless
 - If anyone has clients with CCS services, talk to your housing coordinator to see if would be eligible for these beds.
 - We can place other clients as well. So far referrals from CES, placed 2 clients in there already
 - Connie: MHD or CCS clients would need voucher?

- Deni: Yes, go through the CES system and we pull referrals from there.
- Connie: Name for it?
 - Punawai is the name for the whole building

- Richard: IDs -- navigators have been trying to get appts, haven't been able to get any, only in March - even have been trying around the island. At full capacity
- Tooa - no updates, at full capacity
- Emma
 - ID challenges often around the documentation required to apply for ID --- documentation requirements needed for a new ID, not simply a replacement. Want to try to simplify the system.
 - Informed by military that enforcement around bike path from Pearl Harbor down to Waipahu -- please let people along there know if they want services. Week of 2/18
 - People are starting to get 2nd round of economic impact payment -- may be going to same address as originally put, be aware to not throw out - be on look out for this. Windowed white envelope, navy blue logo says Economic Impact Payment --- looks like scam b/c says important info on payment enclosed -- will feel debit card in it. Doesn't say Treasury on the outside. IRS website has images of what it looks like.
