Planned, designed, and built from a community-centered concept, this new site offers a fresh new approach to housing our homeless neighbors with aloha and inclusion. These planned communities consist of 36 tiny permanent, supportive housing units known as kauhales.

Kama'okū Kalaeloa is an important resource to help individuals transition from persistent homelessness into a transformative and supportive community that fosters a sense of ohana and ownership among residents.

ELIGIBILITY

In addition to requiring a small amount of rent based on personal income, applicants must meet the following criteria for consideration:

- Must be single no couples, children or pets (service animals welcome)
- Must have VISPDAT score of 8 or greater
- Income must be below 60% AMI
- Must not be a convicted sex offender or have been convicted of arson
- Must not have been convicted of violent crime within past two years
- Must be either homeless or chronically homeless
