

Local Continuum of Care (CoC) Updates



Hawaii County Council passed Bill 111, which will earmark a portion of tax revenues on luxury homes for homeless programs and housing. The Bill is estimated to generate \$7 million in revenue annually. A big MAHALO to Community Alliance Partners (CAP) and other advocates for support of this legislation.



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Local Continuum of Care (CoC) Updates



The two Continua of Care – Bridging the Gap and Partners in Care – were recently awarded a total of \$16,875,553 in federal funds from HUD. This was an increase over the prior level of federal funding available through the annual CoC competition.



A recent history of Safe Zone Parking in east Hawaii...



- ICIA collaborated with local agencies to develop the concept of Safe Zone Parking.
 - People in housing transition or chronically without a home, but own a car, will often struggle to find legal and secure areas
- October 2017 multiorganization Summit on Homelessness held in Hilo.
- A handful of faith communities signed up to be "Safe Zone" parking locations.
- Neighborhood Place of Puna and Hope Services were primary contacts for the Coordinated Entry System and Safe Zone Parking inquiries.

FAMILY PROMISE OF HAWAI'I



Our mission is to help homeless and lowincome families in Hawai'i achieve sustainable independence by mobilizing existing community resources and support.

OUR START

We began in March 2006 in Kailua, coordinating the efforts of local congregations to house three to five homeless families in their facilities for one week, once a quarter. This model was called the Interfaith Hospitality Network or rotational model.



COVID IMPACTS

The rotational model has been suspended since March 2020 due to the pandemic. Since then, we have been sheltering families at hotels & a student dorm facility. Our congregation partners continue to support by providing meals & donated items.
